This essay contest will give you an opportunity to celebrate Juneteenth holiday in our city by creating an essay to be emailed by June 10, 2023 and then come out to celebrate together in Prairie Village with free, family fun activities on Saturday, June 17 from 4 to 7 p.m. at Harmon Park.

Gift card prizes of \$100, \$50, and \$25 for the top 3 essays in each age group: 13 to 15 and 16 to 18 for a total of 6 winners! All student winning essays will be on public display at the celebration. The top two winners will have their essay read during the celebration.
